Yes and No. While there are still some remote Aboriginal communities, Aboriginal people live in the city too. There are also communities and families in the surrounding areas which are easily accessible by car or bus. The Noongar people were in Western Australia long before the Europeans arrived and they still remain very connected to the land. But it is not just Noongar anymore, there are also other language groups represented in the Perth area.

Well there you have it, a very brief but hopefully informative introduction to Perth. I realize that this does not due justice to the diversity and complexity of life and the people in Australia. But I wanted to provide you with a foundation for prayer and future updates.
